



Dr. Eagen is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Molecular and Cellular Biology at Baylor College of Medicine, Houston, Texas. The title of his funded project is: Transcriptional Regulation and Drug Sensitivity Through Chromosome 3D Structure Rewiring by a Brain Tumor Fusion Oncoprotein.
